Why a Review

- Termed a Trustee Determination and Distribution Review or a D&D Review
- YRDSB is required to assess Trustee D&D each election year
- No comprehensive study since 2014
- Need to take into account population growth and changing patterns of student enrolment and number of schools
- Time frame is 2022 2034

Major Components

- Two major components of a D&D Review
 - 1. A **determination** of the number of trustees on the YRDSB; and,
 - 2. The **distribution** of these trustees within York Region



Current Situation

- 12 elected trustees
- 1 appointed Indigenous trustee
- 2 student trustees
- 1 Indigenous student trustee




Current Situation

- Elected Trustee Areas
 - Aurora and King 1 Trustee
 - East Gwillimbury and Whitchurch-Stouffville 1 Trustee
 - Newmarket 1 Trustee
 - Georgina 1 Trustee
 - Richmond Hill 2 Trustees
 - Vaughan 2 Trustees
 - Markham 3 Trustees
 - Markham (Ward 1) and Vaughan
 (Ward 5) 1 Trustee



YRDSB D & D REVIEW





Key Parameters

- Three key parameters:
 - 1. YRDSB must have a minimum of 11 elected trustees
 - 2. YRDSB can have a maximum of 12 elected trustees
 - 3. Trustee Areas must follow existing municipal ward boundaries, but may cross municipal boundaries
- Within these parameters, YRDSB may use its judgement



Approach

Four factors:

- 1. Number of public school electors
- 2. Number of schools elementary and secondary
- 3. Number of students elementary and secondary
- 4. Community Education Centre area boundaries

What is an Electoral Quotient?

- The electoral quotient (EQ) determines how much each Trustee
 Area is above or below the average for the number of public
 school electors across the entire YRDSB
- In 2018 there were 689,471 public school electors
- If all Trustee Areas had the same number of electors, there would be 57,456 in each Trustee Area
- The electoral quotient indicates how far above or below this average each Trustee Area is
- The EQ is a rough measure of "rep-by-pop" or, more accurately, representation by elector



Developing Trustee Area Options

- Conform with the requirements of the Education Act and its Regulations
- Balance the four factors
- Create implementable options



The D&D Review – Step by Step

- Six major steps in the YRDSB's D&D Review
 - 1. Detailed project plan & timeline (complete)
 - 2. Background Research (April 6 May 14)
 - 3. Phase 1 Consultation Process (April 19 July 16)
 - 4. Phase 2 Consultation Process (Aug. 16 Sept. 25)
 - 5. Information Report with draft options (Sept. 27 Nov. 2)
 - 6. Final Report with recommendations (Nov. 8, 2021 January 2022)



Step 2 – Background Research

- Purpose: To collect qualitative and quantitative information for Trustee D & D
- Components:
 - Legislation, best practices, status of municipal ward boundary reviews, YRDSB Strategic Plan and Priorities; changes to Community Education Centre Areas, if any
 - 2. Assessment of existing Trustee Electoral Areas
 - Trends and projections for 2022 to 2034 for general population; public school electors, school locations; number of students

Step 3 – Phase 1 Consultation Process

- Purpose: To educate/collect input on Trustee
 Area boundaries and issues
- Components:
 - Project webpage <u>www.yrdsb.ca/TDD</u>
 - Project e-mail address <u>trustee.services@yrdsb.ca</u>
 - Letter to Parents/Guardians May 10
 - Outreach on social media starts mid-May
 - Individual interviews with 13 trustees plus one student trustee meeting – May 7 – 21
 - Media release May 11

Step 3 – Phase 1 Consultation Process

More:

- Newspaper ads May 13
- On-line survey for all public school electors May 14 June
 18
- Educational webinars May 17, May 26
- Trustee message re D&D Review June
- Stakeholder group meetings June 7, June 9
- Senior Team meeting June 7
- Analyze findings from Phase 1/develop possible
 Trustee Area configurations



Step 4 – Phase 2 Consultation Process

- Purpose: To collect feedback on possible
 Trustee Area configurations
- Components:
 - Joint trustee meetings (2)
 - Newspaper ads
 - Elector/stakeholder meetings (one per CEC area)
 - Check-in with municipalities doing ward boundary reviews
- Result: Draft Trustee Area options



Step 5 – Information Report with Options

- Purpose: Preparation and presentation of Information Report, including Draft Options
- Components:
 - Information Report with Draft Options to Board Standing Committee – October 19
 - Information Report with Draft Options to Board of Trustees – Nov. 2



Step 6 – Final Report with Recommendations

- Purpose: Preparation and presentation of Final Report with recommendations
- Components:
 - Individual interviews with 13 trustees plus one student trustee meeting to collect feedback on options – Nov. 8 - 19
 - Draft Final Report with recommendations Nov. 22
 - Dec. 3
 - Final Report with recommendations to Board of Trustees – January 2022
