Survey responses will not affect any current or future services participants receive from York Region or influence Health Canada's review process.

Up-to-Date Vaccine Information and Clinics

The COVID-19 vaccine is not a one-dose or a two-dose vaccine. Like many other routine childhood vaccines, you need a primary series (first shots) and a booster for highly effective and long-lasting protection.

At this time, everyone ages five to 11 needs **two doses** of vaccine, with a likely third dose in the next few months. Everyone 12 and older needs and is currently eligible for **three doses**.

Older individuals' immunity wanes faster than younger people, and they are more likely to suffer serious illness from COVID-19. Individuals 60 years of age and older are now eligible to get their **fourth dose**.

Being vaccinated with three doses has been shown to decrease the likelihood of infection and serious illness. Studies have shown that being vaccinated with three doses also decreases the amount of virus in your body, decreasing your chances of passing COVID-19 on to others. The more people in the community with a third dose, the less transmission there will be and the faster we can get back to pre-pandemic life.
