

Developmental Services Ontario (DSO) Assists adults (18+ years) with developmental disabilities to access services and supports in their communities.

DSO Eligibility: Individuals must be at least 16 years of age to begin the application process however, individuals must be 18 years or older to receive services. **Requirements for application:** 1. Proof of Ontario residency 2. Proof of age 3. A psychological assessment indicating a Developmental Disability.

Supports include: Case Management, Caregiver Respite, Community Participation Supports (Day Programs), Person-Directed Planning, Residential Supports, Behaviour Services, Passport Program.

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Translation: Government funding, transition planning and community support services translated into downloadable materials in Arabic, Cantonese, Italian, Mandarin, Spanish, Urdu and Vietnamese.

<u>Passport Program</u> A financial resource designed to assist adults with a developmental disability with the cost of support including: day programs, respite, transportation expenses, programs, classes, camps and much more. *Applications must be made through Developmental Services Ontario (DSO)*. 1-855-277-2121

<u>Your Support Services Network (YSSN)</u> A community-based agency that offers a range of case management and community crisis services throughout York Region to support individuals with a Developmental Disability and/or a serious mental illness in accessing appropriate supports and services. Assistance for Children with Severe Disabilities (ACSD) (Up to 18 yrs) Provides financial support for lowto moderate-income families to cover some of the extra costs of caring for a child who has a severe disability. A parent/legal guardian whose child is under 18 years of age, lives at home and has a severe disability may be eligible to receive help under this program. Call MCCSS.

Assistive Devices Program (ADP) (All Ages) Subsidized funding for customized equipment for individuals with long-term physical disabilities. To be eligible, one must be an Ontario resident, have a valid Ontario health card, have a disability requiring equipment or supplies for six months or longer, and is not based on income. ADP covers 75% of the cost for equipment and supplies and families pay the remaining 25%. Equipment and supplies include mobility aids, hearing aids and other devices, communication aids, visual aids, diabetic equipment and supplies, respiratory equipment and supplies, home oxygen therapy, artificial eyes and facial prosthetics, custom orthotic braces, compression garments and more. adp@ontario.ca.

March Break Reimbursement Fund (Up to 17 yrs, identified with Autism)

Families must retain the services of a one-to-one support worker **OR** have paid for their child to attend a March Break camp or program, but not both. Maximum reimbursements are \$350 per child. Applications must be received between mid-December to mid-January. Ontario Autism Program (OAP) (Up to 17 yrs)

The OAP provides all families of children and youth with ASD with flexible, family-centred services based on each child's unique needs. Families with children under age six are eligible to receive one time funding of \$20,000 per child, while families with children aged six and older are eligible to receive \$5,000 per child. Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP) (18 yrs - 65 yrs) Income Support

Financial support for eligible adults designed to assist with cost of living expenses, prescription, vision and dental coverage. Shelter Allowance available for separate living accommodations. Apply six months prior to 18th birthday. Eligibility is determined by financial income of Applicant Not Household.

Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP) (16 yrs +) Employment Support

Provides work-related support to prepare individuals for employment. Services include assessment, resume writing, interview skills and support, job development, job coaching and job maintenance.

Ontario Works (OW) (16 yrs +)

Income and employment assistance for residents of Ontario in immediate financial need and willing to participate in employment assistance activities. 1-877-464-9675

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Special Services at Home (SSAH) (Up to 17 yrs)

Assists families caring for a child with a Developmental or Physical Disability to pay for relief/respite services in the home or outside the family home as long as the child is not receiving support from a residential program (living in a group home). (905) 567-7177 or 1-877-832-2818

• Enhanced Respite Funding This grant is paid to families who are caring for a child who is medically fragile and/or depends on a technological device, and requires care 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. It is provided in addition to other respite services. Families may be eligible for up to \$3,500 per child, per year.

Trillium Drug Program (All Ages)

The Trillium Drug Program helps Ontarians pay for high prescription-drug costs. Eligibility includes having a valid Ontario health card, not already enrolled in the Ontario Drug Benefit program, do not have an insurance plan with 100% coverage and spend 4% or more of after-tax household income on prescription drug costs. Financial and Legal Supports

<u>Canada Caregiver Credit (CCC)</u> (All Ages) Available to spouse, common law or dependent with a physical or mental impairment completed through the standard tax return. 1-800-959-8281

Disability Tax Credit (DTC) (All Ages) Available to eligible persons with disabilities. The DTC reduces the amount of tax owed by a person to the government. An individual may apply for the DTC by completing Form T2201. 1-800-959-8281 *An individual deemed eligible for the DTC will then be eligible to open a RDSP.*

<u>Registered Disability Savings Plan (RDSP)</u> (Up to 59 yrs) A long-term savings plan that is designed to meet the needs of people with disabilities and their families. An RDSP may be opened by any individual who qualifies for the Disability Tax Credit (DTC). For those 49 years of age and under, the Government of Canada

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matches money deposited into an RDSP with grants of up to \$3500 per year (government will match up to lifetime maximum of \$90,000) and provides a bond of up to \$1000 for individuals living on a low income. An RDSP is an exempt asset under ODSP. 1-800-959-8281

<u>Henson Trust/Discretionary Trust</u> (All Ages) Protects the assets of a person living with a disability and their right to collect government benefits, inheritance and entitlements without losing their Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP) monthly income. In the event a vulnerable person requires police assistance, valuable caregiver contact and vulnerable person descriptive information can be accessed by police. If the vulnerable person is under 16 years old, the profile will need to be renewed every year on their birthdate. If over 16 years old a renewal is required every two years on their birthdate. Online registration is preferred.
