

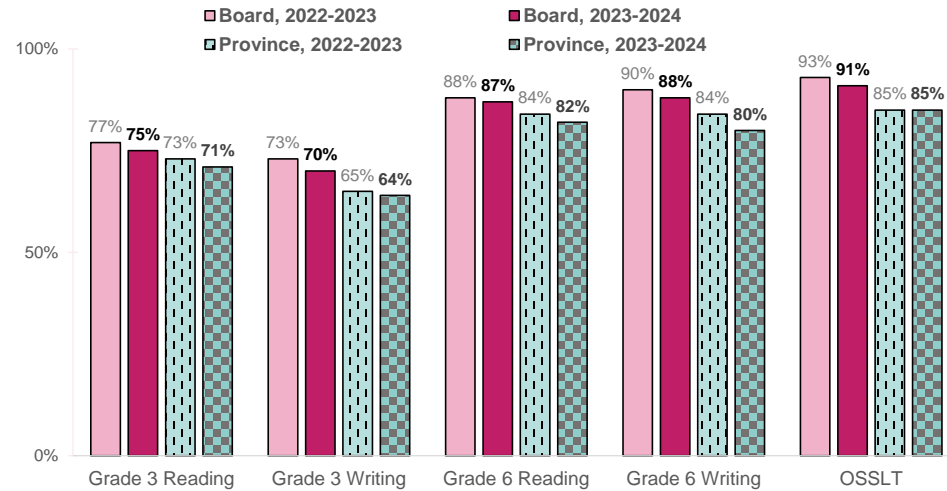

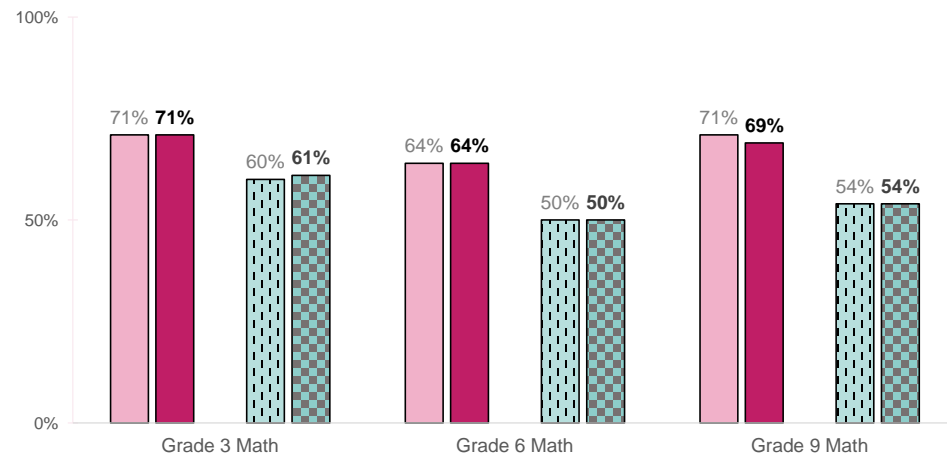

Measure: % of students who met or exceeded the provincial standard on EQAO Assessments for Grade 3/6/9 Math



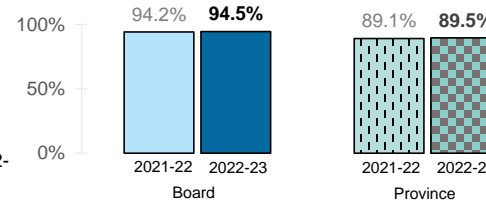

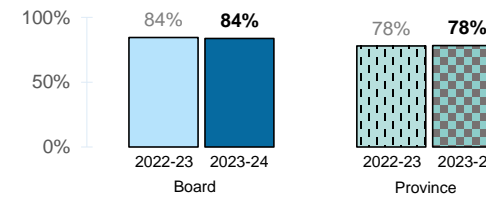

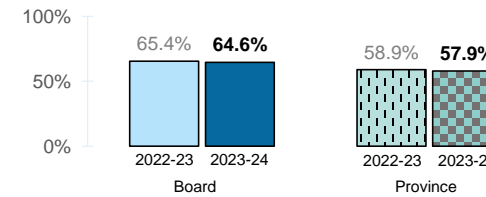

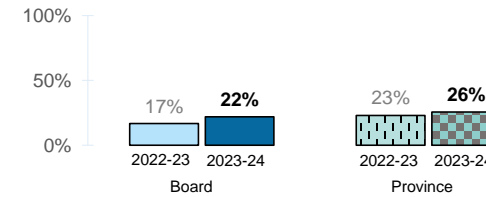

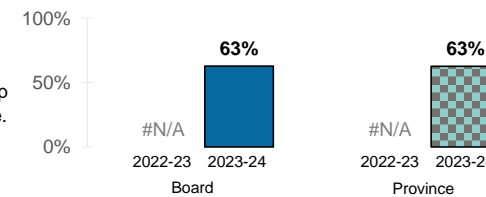

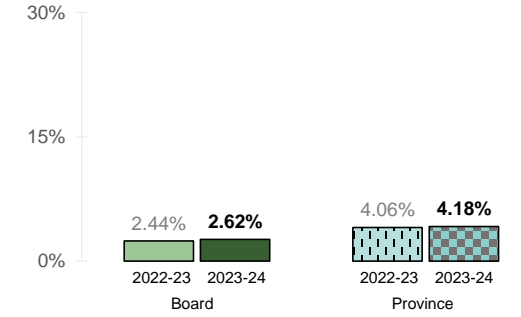

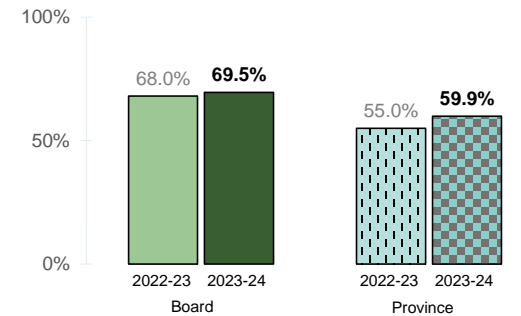

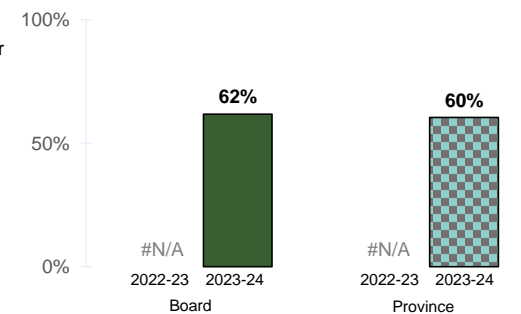

Goal: Improve students' literacy learning and achievement

Actions our School Board Will Take to

Literacy Teachers in every elementary school to support the early reading screening tool implementation and to provide tiered interventions for students with a focus on K-3.

PRI-LIT teachers provide tier 2 and 3 interventions in literacy focus schools identified through board data analysis, including SVI data and early reading screening data.

Math Facilitators in each Priority Math School to support teacher efficacy as identified through the Ministry of Education and EQAO results.

Math Network learning for each Family of Schools to build capacity in mathematics instruction across the grades through collaborative problem solving and universal design for learning. Additional learning focused on the use of the digital tool MATHUp.

DECE professional learning focused on early literacy acquisition.

Embedding of strategies from the YRDSB's "How Processing Affects Learning" Waterfall document through Professional Learning that outlines intervention strategies for students with varied learning needs. Allows for targeted and timely intervention and scaffolding of the learning.

Professional Learning opportunities on the integration of strategies that support Multilingual Language Learners across subject areas.

System learning for administrators focusing on leading math learning in schools and the use of high impact instructional strategies.

Students who are unsuccessful on the fall OSSLT are provided with a second opportunity in the spring with targeted interventions to support areas of need between the two writing opportunities.

School Improvement Planning development directly linked to the Multi-Year Strategic Plan and District Action Plan.

Promotion of SHSM, Dual Credits OYAP and OYAP-FAST through activities in schools, parent outreach and professional learning

College panel conversations with Student Success and Guidance Counselors to increase awareness of program options for students

Student Success teachers in secondary schools who provide support for students in grade 9 and 10 to obtain credits and meet with success in their high school years.

Visits to high school by teachers and grade 7 and 8 students to assist in the transition to Secondary school.

Cross panel meetings to create transition plans from elementary to secondary school

Utilize the Transitions Strategy to build staff capacity to support transitions to all pathways

York Region Skills Challenge at Humber College to facilitate problem based learning in STEM fields and build interest in the trades.

York Region Skills professional learning where elementary teachers can explore the challenges in the competition and to build interest in the trades, STEM, and problem based learning.

Engaging parents throughout Kindergarten to grade 12 in pathway dialogues and decisions at parent nights, pathway information sessions, and school council meetings.

Learning Together Symposium: Welcome to Kindergarten parent and child conference to support parents in experiencing the Kindergarten classroom with their child.

Youth S.P.A.C.E (Students Promoting Awareness Connection and Empowerment) in 155 schools with the rest of the schools to

LAMPS presentations (Learning About Mental health Presentation Series) continues in grades 1- 12+ classrooms and to parents and caregivers. Topics this year included Anxiety and Coping, Healthy Relationships, Social Media and Mental Health.

Mental Health Liaisons at each school supporting the sharing of information related to the Mental Health and Addiction Strategy.

Mental Health Lessons developed by Mental Health Ontario in grades 7, grade 8 and grade 10 careers course to build strategies and awareness of mental health supports and services.

Promotion of the importance of attendance in student achievement through school communications such as newsletters and student start up information.

Creating affirming learning spaces including learning gardens that support Indigenous ways of knowing, understanding ableism and creating Black affirming learning spaces.

Increased expectations of consultation with Caring and Safe schools administrators prior to suspension to have a reflective conversation.
