



YRDSB Budget Profile




YRDSB is the 3rd largest school district in Ontario with an operating budget of 1.8B (PSAB standard)








How Board Allocates Funds: 2024-2025 Operating Budget

By Function Areas Instruction 84.4% Including school-based staffing, school administration and other **Expenses:** program staff, textbooks / supplies, computers and equipment and staff training School operations and maintenance (caretakers, utilities) **School** 8.9% **Operations: Transportation:** Busing costs to transport students to and from school 3.0% Administration Central board departmental staff and operating costs such as 2.4% **Expenses:** director's office, IT, human resources, finance as well as trustees etc. 1.2% **Debt and Other-**Cost of financing and other miscellaneous costs including **Expenses:** secondment costs etc.




