
To honour this agreement we will take up our responsibility to be respectful of their traditions, knowledge and inherent rights as sovereign nations.


Background: Secondary French Immersion at Newmarket HS

- French Immersion program started at Newmarket HS in 2007
 - Originated from Aurora HS due to growth in French Immersion program
 - Currently only location serving Newmarket, East Gwillimbury and Georgina
 - October 31, 2023 French Immersion Enrolment:

Grade 9	Grade 10	Grade 11	Grade 12	Total
188	164	179	166	697

- Newmarket High School
 - Current utilization is 126% including 8 portables on site (or 147% excluding portables)
 - No additional portables may be added to the site
- An additional French Immersion secondary program is required due to:
 - Residential development
 - Growing enrolment from the elementary panel

Background: French Immersion Boundary




Proposed Secondary School French Immersion Boundaries

Proposed Huron Heights SS FI Program



Benefits of Additional French Immersion Program


- Balances French Immersion enrolment across multiple secondary schools
- Allows for French Immersion growth
- Supports the business case for a future East Gwillimbury Secondary School by utilizing existing capacity at Huron Heights SS

Timing and Students Impacted

- New Program at Huron Heights SS would commence September 2025 with incoming Grade 9s that will grow over time to Grade 12
 - By 2028 Grade 9 to Grade 12 French Immersion programming will be offered at Huron Heights SS
- Current Grade 7 French Immersion students who will be Grade 9 in September 2025
 - Students living between Davis Drive in Newmarket and Ravenshoe Road in East Gwillimbury

Newmarket HS Projected Enrolment




Transportation (Policy 680.0)

- Transportation provided as per policy 680
 - ➤ Grades 9 to 12 a secondary school student living in an area served by public transit is not eligible for Board-provided transportation
 - A secondary student living more than 3.2 kilometres from the nearest secondary school in an area not served by public transit is eligible for Board-provided transportation
- School bus transportation eligibility is reviewed annually as York Region Transit (YRT) adjusts and enhances service
- If eligible for Board-provided transportation, Student Transportation Services routes available August 2025 -<u>schoolbuscity.com</u> > Find Your Bus Stop
